BEST KEPT VILLAGE 2014 - JUDGES' COMMENTS

'BKV awareness was tackled through items on the village website, emails to residents, the parish council newsletter, the Stone & Eccleshall Gazette and the Staffordshire Newsletter. There were a number of BKV posters and displays of good quality and eye-catching children's posters around the village.

The church surrounds looked very good overall. Some grass areas had understandably not been cut in May because the large expanses of bluebells were in flower; but there were some areas of untidy grass still in June. The seats and benches were generally sound, but some will need painting/varnishing soon.

The surrounds and car park of the village hall were neat and tidy and weed-free.

There was a pleasant outside drinking area at The Shoulder of Mutton, which looked generally well cared for, except for some litter and weeds, especially around the car park.

The telephone box was very clean inside and the surrounds were litter and weed-free.

The bus shelter was in good condition and clean and tidy inside and out, with up-to-date timetables.

There were excellent planted features on the corner of Meadow Lane and on the bridge in particular. The features on The Green, including the village sign and the well, were praised by the May judges.

The May judges said that Tudor Hollow was a generally pleasant area; but it did need some "tidying up" and it was spoilt by dog mess. Other small open spaces and verges were tidy.

Almost all the private gardens were very well maintained; and the June judges said that some "stood out as being magnificent".

The equipment in both play areas was very good and the safety surfaces were sound. There was, however, litter in the area near the village hall and judges were concerned about the lack of a fence between the play area and the wooded area at the rear.

The residents clearly care for their village. A very good standard has been achieved in recent years and the hard work put in this year maintained those standards. Competition was again very close in the Stafford area and very little separated the "best" villages. Congratulations on what has been achieved in 2014 and on achieving Highly Commended again.' It is hoped to involve descendants of the men from the Fulford area who gave their lives in the Great War in a ceremony of commemoration. POST BOX NEWS

Royal Mail has altered the collection time for the box by the village green. The mail from this low-use box has moved to 'collection on delivery' with the postie emptying the box on their morning delivery round, rather than providing a dedicated collection by van. A later collection from the box on Fulford Road in the late afternoon will still occur.

BUS SERVICE 4 - use it or lose it!

The 249 service through Fulford was merged with the 250 in April and operates between Longton and Stone via Meir Heath, Rough Close and Oulton; this is now renumbered as Bennetts Service 4. The service times have again been changed from 1st September and it no longer serves Hilderstone or Moddershall, but does give 2 or 4 hours shopping time in Stone or in Longton each day.
