BEST KEPT VILLAGE 2017

Fulford again entered the 'Best Kept Village' competition gaining Highly Commended. The judges' detailed comments are available on the village website <u>www.fulfordvillage.com/bkv-results.php</u> but below is a summary of the main points. Bearing in mind the months of road works in the village and the disruption and chaos leading up to the judging, everyone should be very proud!

"Fulford is a neat and tidy village, with very little litter. There was good evidence of community involvement, especially the numerous social events and BKV campaigns throughout the year and the many colourful planters around the village."

Whilst there were many favourable comments – BKV awareness, posters, Village Green, there were some improvements suggested at the churchyard, Village Hall, phone box and war memorial.

The village well was noted as being renovated; the village sign was an attractive feature which enhanced the Village Green and there were some nice, colourful planters around the village, including the ones on the bridge railings.

The Village Hall surrounds and car park were very neat and tidy with a number of attractive planted areas although there were small amounts of litter in May.

The Shoulder of Mutton car park was very tidy and free of weeds. The beer garden looked attractive and well cared for, with its community herb garden providing a nice touch. It was noted however that the bench on the Green would need painting soon.

St Nicholas' churchyard was pretty well maintained overall. It may be worth considering designated wildlife/conservation areas which could be left unmown to reduce the amount of "close grass cutting". The car park was tidy and the noticeboard was in good condition.

The children's play area was in a delightful setting, and all the equipment was well maintained and in good condition. The safety surfaces were good and the area was clean and litter free.

GARDEN COMPETITION

A very pleasant weekday evening in June was spent walking round the village looking at an incredible variety of beautiful front gardens. The standard was very high and choosing the prize winners was a very difficult task for last year's winners, Ruth and Peter Wilkinson however, four winners were chosen and have received vouchers and the winner of this year's large front garden award will be next year's judges.

BUTTERFLIES AND SUNFLOWERS

There were very mixed results in the sunflower competition with some sunflowers growing healthily and some not growing at all despite the best of encouragement. The successful sunflowers were measured in August however, with three prizes being awarded for the following very impressive plants -

Tallest sunflower – John and Evelyn Hooley 265cms (just over 9 feet!!!)

Most flowers on one sunflower plant - Jessica with 10 flowers

Prettiest sunflower – Benjy and Dex Blumstein (the red variety)

The butterflies, under the careful nurturing of Sal Jones, did very well and there were three magical releases in the village of about 100 delicate butterflies that had developed from chrysalises in nets over a period of weeks. It is hoped to repeat the project next year with an increased variety of butterflies.

PHOTOGRAPHIC COMPETITION

The standard of photography on the theme of '**Fulford and its Fauna and Flora**' was incredibly high and nearly 100 people took the opportunity to vote for their favourite photos at the pub birthday in July, the final choir rehearsal of the year and the welcome evening for the new vicar in the village hall. The winning photographers have received vouchers and the photos will be framed and on display in the pub shortly. Because the photos for the calendar need to be seasonal and landscape (as opposed to portrait) the photos for the Fulford Calendar 2018 will be selected from all entries.
