BKV – THE JUDGES COMMENTS

As you can see below, apart from some dog fouling and litter and the upkeep of some notice boards and seats, the judges' response was generally good with many favourable comments about the Church, the Pub and the Village Hall.

"There was good BKV awareness, particularly through the village news and parish magazine and two excellent displays of children's posters on the village green and by the village hall. The posters were very colourful and imaginative. Well done!

The telephone box was excellent inside and out, was free from litter and well cared for. The bus shelter was in good condition both inside and out, with current bus timetables on display.

There were lovely garden features at Town End and Fulford Road; and the new village sign and memorial well were also distinctive and well cared for.

There was very little litter seen during judging (except as noted at the village hall in June and the cigarette ends by the pub); and no dog fouling (except in the churchyard in May). There was clear evidence of community awareness of and involvement in BKV and the judges commented on the range of community activities available.

The pretty planters around the village helped enhance Fulford's appearance, making it a very pleasant village to visit. There was a very good standard of care across the range of BKV features and the judges felt that there was excellent community spirit and involvement throughout the village. NEWS FROM FULFORD COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS:

Fulford CFRs have been quite busy in 2013. We have had a little over 400 call-outs so far this year (up to the end of October). Over the last couple of months we have been called out on average, every 2 hours. We are becoming even busier than earlier in the year and this is likely to continue over the winter months where our services are often in higher demand. We have now had in excess of 1600 calls up to the end of October 2013 since the group formed in July 2008. We are very grateful for the support given by 'The Shoulder' and the pub-goers for the weekly pub quiz nights. Although these weekly sandwiches, chips and beer may not be good for your waistline this fundraising keeps our car on the road, so thank you!

We are always looking for volunteers, particularly as we recently lost 4 of our members who are now training to be full-time staff for the ambulance service. This leaves us with only a handful of responders, **we need your help, we need more volunteers.** No prior experience is required as full training is provided by the ambulance service with experience on the road with other responders for as long as is needed. Training to be an Intermediate CFR takes about 7 days (usually over weekends) plus two shifts with a paramedic on the road.
