## FULFEST 2012- what a great day!

Compared to the previous weeks and particularly the previous day, when at one time all the roads out of Fulford were flooded, the weather was kind for Fulfest 2012 and the village was able to enjoy good music, food, drink and each other's company. The music started at 2.00 and carried on until late in the pub but by mid-morning the following day the village green was back to normal. Thank you to everyone who baked cakes, collected money, organised car tours of the village green (and raised nearly £100!), the musicians, the technicians and Steve and the staff of the pub who made it such a memorable and fun day. Now for Fulfest 2013!

Some people were asking where the money goes that is raised on the day and so to clarify:

- Fulfest is organised by a small group of unpaid volunteers as a free community event for the village, with many hours spent before, during and after the event to make it successful
- The money raised on the day and in advance is used in the organisation of the following year's festival. A small amount of money is kept aside for unplanned expenses.
- This year the Festival cost £1150 to put on, with the money raised used to pay for insurance, the marquee, the road closures and signs, first aid and for one of the bands on the Green - most of the musicians play out of goodwill, or some lunch and a bottle of wine at the most.

Plans are underway for a fundraising event in the New Year for Fulfest 2013. Please try and support the evening as this, along with the raffle and collection on the day, will provide the main income for next year's festival.

Haven't we all seen Gareth Malone on the television and thought, I wonder whether singing with friends is as much fun as it looks? I wonder whether with a bit of help I could sing? Well Fulford now has its own community choir and its very own Gareth Malone in the guise of the professional choir trainer Dan Hollingshurst! This choir open to all – there will be **no auditions** (just be willing to have a go) and **no singing on your own**. No previous experience of singing / singing in a choir is required, **it doesn't matter if you can't read music** and **it doesn't matter if you don't think you can sing** – just come and have a go!

## FULFORD VILLAGE SIGN

To commemorate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee and celebrate the village community, the Parish Council has agreed to fund a village sign to be erected on the corner of the Green near the well. There has been a very positive response to the design that was displayed at Fulfest and more recently at the Church for feedback. Village signs originated in Norfolk where nearly every village has a sign designed specifically to reflect their area. The Fulford sign content was put together as a group effort and does the same, reflecting the Church, the farming, the wildflowers and the origin of the name of the village. The sign also incorporates the Jubilee and the Staffordshire Knot and will be made in black steel with gold decoration on an oak post. Thank you to Kath Tooth for putting the final art work together.

Responding to BKV judges' comments, a new roadside notice board has been commissioned from a craftsman in the village - please don't use it for football practice - it has already been damaged! The Committee with its own funds and having secured grants from the Staffordshire Environmental Fund, Fulford Parish Council, Staffordshire County Council, and from Stafford Borough Council, has undertaken a building programme to create a rear extension to the hall which will provide an ante-room, storage, and direct access to the grassed area. This will benefit all hirers and also the pre-school which operates from the Large Hall.

Little Learners pre-school has vacancies for children aged 2 years and above, and will also be starting a "Play and Stay" session on a Wednesday morning in the autumn.

## **FIRST RESPONDERS - What is a Community First Responder?**

Community First Responders are teams of volunteers who are trained by the Ambulance Service to a nationally recognised level and provide life- saving treatment to people in their local communities. The group is self- funded and receives no grants or financial support from the ambulance service or government, they just give us the radio and the training. A CFR is always backed up by an ambulance resource, whether that is paramedic in a car, or a traditional ambulance.

Since going 'live' in July 2008, Fulford and District CFR's have responded to 969 call outs (up to end of July 2012). The call outs were 16 in the 6 months to the end of 2008, 31 in 2009, 156 in 2010, 290 in 2011, 476 in the first 7 months of 2012. As you can see our services are being required much more often! We need more volunteers to become CFR's or supporters of the group in other ways if you don't fancy the 'medical side' of it. We do respond to any calls and locations that the ambulance service need us to when it gets busy, but we do get quite a lot of calls to 'our patch' which covers Meir Heath to Moddershall, Sandon, Milwich, Leigh, Blythe Bridge and everything in between. Training to be an Intermediate CFR takes about 7 days (usually over weekends) plus two shifts with a paramedic on the road. You can improve your skills by becoming an Enhanced CFR further down the line with about 7 more days training. If you want to give something back to the community or are just interested to know more, give **Mike (07703475888) or Nic (07736327397)** a call. Alternatively if you see us about, stop for a chat, unless we are in a rush we are more than happy to speak to you.

## **HEART START....**

Heart Start courses are **free** 2 hour sessions that cover what to do in the following situations; choking, heart attack, unconsciousness, severe bleeding, not breathing. There is the opportunity to discuss what you would do, and have a go at most things! The sessions are relaxed and informal with interaction, and you don't just get talked at! You get a certificate of attendance at the end of the session. If you are interested in attending one of these sessions give Mike (07703475888) or Nic (07736327397) a call. One person in the village has already benefited from attending the course having had to deal with two bleeding incidents that both required hospital treatment. The knowledge and confidence gained from the training was invaluable.
