With the wonderful selection of winter scenes submitted in the photographic competition this year it has been possible to print Christmas cards of the village – this is a first for Fulford and an exciting new venture. The cost of the packs has not yet been decided but, as with the calendar, all money raised will go towards funding projects in Fulford so money well spent!

HALLOWEEN GHOST WALK Sunday 28th October 6.00 p.m. starting from the Shoulder of Mutton

Starting from the Shoulder of Mutton at 6.00 p.m. on Sunday 28th October there will be a Halloween Ghost walk around the village. The walk will last about 40 minutes and there will be prizes for best fancy dress (child and adult) to be judged in the pub after the walk. Ghosts are guaranteed on this walk so it is not suitable for those of a nervous disposition....!!!!

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 11th November

Sunday 11th November has even more significance this year, marking the 100th anniversary of the end of World War 1 and to reflect this, there is a choice of events in Fulford for people to attend to pay their respects. As well as the traditional service at St Nicholas' Church at 10.45 where the last post will be played by the war memorial (weather permitting) with the traditional prayers and readings there will also be a special commemorative event at the pub starting from 10.00 where 200 crosses representing family members who have fought in any war will be stand as a reminder of their sacrifice. These crosses will have been blessed by the Church and will be available to be bought from 1st November for £2.50 each with all funds raised going to the Royal British Legion. This will be followed by an Act of Remembrance and later a singalong of wartime songs.

When the Tower Of London poppies became available for sale the Parish bought 20. From these, framed, certificated poppies are now on display in the village halls and two wreaths have been made using six poppies each commemorating the 12 from Fulford who died in the Great War. Incorporated is a horse shoe from the Queens Regiment and symbolic barbed wire – particularly poignant reminders of World War 1. These beautiful and evocative wreaths will be on display at each event in the village on Armistice Day. In addition, in the evening a brazier will be lit at Meir Heath at 7.00 joining a line of fires across the country.

TOMMY - a nationwide installation for the Fallen

Have you seen Tommy by the village hall, head bowed with his rifle in hand? There But Not There's life size Tommies can be seen around the UK and is the 2018 Armistice project for the charity *Remembered* whose aim is to educate all generations about the ultimate sacrifice but also to raise substantial funds to help heal those suffering from the hidden wounds of war. The Parish Council has been successful in obtaining from the Armed Forces Covenant Fund, four silhouettes for the community, which once again show the ability of art in communicating a powerful and moving message.

VILLAGE LEAF CLEAR Sunday 18th November 11.00 a.m.

Every year the leaves need clearing from the village green and surrounding paths to keep the paths safe and to allow the grass to grow in the spring. This is a task for a small army of volunteers so if you have a spare hour on Sunday 18th November please come along with a rake, bags will be provided.

VILLAGE WALKS 11.00 from the village green

The walks take place on the first Sunday of every month starting from the village green at 11.00 a.m. and returning by about 1.00 p.m. The walks are on the roads and footpaths around Fulford and are a great way of taking exercise, getting to know people in the village, catching up on the news and seeing and learning more about the environment in which we live. New to the village? Then this is a great thing to do!

FULFORD COMMUNITY CHOIR Sundays (roughly fortnightly) 4.00 – 6.00 p.m.

Everyone is welcome to join Fulford Community Choir but if you are not sure it is for you come along and attend a rehearsal for free, you will find everyone is very friendly, there are no auditions and you will not be asked to sing on your own! This term the choir will be singing at the Village Fair, their Christmas concert and the Church Carol service — lots of festive music! FOCUS ON A FULFORD RESIDENT - ANDREW HARGREAVES talks about his life with racing pigeons.

Born in 1950, I soon fell in love with my father's hobby of racing pigeons and together we formed a partnership which lasted until he died when I was 27. My wife, Linda, took over from my father and we have been operating from our home in Moss Gate near Fulford ever since. Pigeon racing has given us so many happy times, but there have been sad ones too, especially when one of our favourite birds either goes missing, or dies! We have had many fabulous weekends away at Blackpool, where some 30,000 pigeon flyers attend the annual pigeon show.

As a lifelong member of the Blythe Bridge Homing Society, we get the opportunity to race our birds with two of the strongest Federations in the country. We have had many successes in their competitions, but it had always been my ambition to win a Midlands National Flying (MNFC) race. With many of the country's best flyers competing, this event is very difficult to win! After many years of trying, in 2012 I finally achieved my ambition. In the race from Vire (France), a distance of 287 miles to our loft, we managed to beat 4507 pigeons, with our best bird, a blue hen we named Mystery Girl. It was a very hot day and only the best, fittest birds would excel. Reports on the local grapevine of earlier timings further south of the country, made it apparent that for any chance to do well in the results, landing before 3-00pm would be needed. At 2-57pm, Mystery Girl, to my great delight, landed and clocked in on the Electric Timing System (ETS). Later that afternoon, after all the other birds had landed, I was declared the winner! The phone didn't stop ringing for the next two days with other fanciers congratulating me - I was euphoric!

In 2015 lightning struck twice at the MNFC Young Bird National from Portland on the South coast. One of my entries, later named Ayres Rocket, homed fastest at a speed of 60mph! Well, another very happy night was spent in our local, The Shoulder of Mutton in Fulford, celebrating this latest win with family and friends! As with last year, we plan to enter the MNFC 'One Loft Race' with several family and friends from the pub, 'The Fulford Flyers'. Hopefully we will have a winner! Having been a 'Fancier' for some 50 years, I'm looking forward to many more and who knows with what future success!
