BEST KEPT VILLAGE 2016

It's that time of year again! The banners are up, the children's posters ready for the annual display around the village and maintenance and gardening jobs are scheduled to be done for the beginning of the judging period from May 1st. As in previous years, Fulford will receive two unannounced visits from the Best Kept Village judges, one in May and one in June and if lucky enough to get through to the final round, another visit in July.

There has already been some amazing work from unsung heroes through the year — to highlight just a few look at the playground, the rail planters, the lovely planting around the phone box and village well and the maintenance of the area around the Baulk lane steps. Everyone can do something to help however, whether it is picking up litter, ensuring they pick up after their dog, tidying the verge near their home or just generally keeping an eye out and reporting blocked drains etc. Everyone doing a little is a great way to keep the village at its best!

PHOTOGRAPHIC COMPETITION - closing date June 8th

Last year 150 calendars and 80 packs of notelets were sold to raise money for the village using photos submitted in the village photo competition. GARDEN COMPETITION - week beginning June 18th

This is the chance for anyone in the village to win some gardening vouchers. During the week beginning Monday June 18th some judges from a local nursery will walk the village and choose their favourite gardens in the following categories – small and large front garden, tubs and hanging basket and verge appeal. There is no need to formally enter the competition as all the judging will be done from the pavement. The prizes will be awarded at Fulfest on Saturday 9th July.



AFTERNOON TEA WITH THE CHOIR - Sunday May 8th 4.15 p.m.

The choir trip to Leicester on Saturday March 12th to sing in the Choir Showcase organised by the nationally recognised charity Sing for Pleasure was a great success - the choir sang their short programme of music to the panel of experts and other choirs and received positive, constructive feedback and, apart from having lots of fun, felt very proud of their achievements.

On Sunday May 8th the choir will sing this repertoire again at an afternoon tea concert at the village hall along with some new pieces learnt in the intervening time. Home-made cake and tea will be served, so for just £3.00 a ticket it will be a wonderful way to spend a Sunday afternoon.
