#### **VILLAGE HALL ROOF**

Early this year an application for funding, to replace the main hall roof, was made to the **National Lottery Awards for All** and also to **Fulford Parish Council**, the Holding Trustees. Both requests were extremely successful and raised a combined amount of £15,000 towards the cost (£10,000 from the National Lottery and £5,000 from Fulford Parish Council). With additional funds to cover the total cost coming from our own **Village Hall funds**, this enabled a contractor to be appointed.

Observant villagers will have noticed the profile of the main roof ridge has progressively deteriorated since the hall was built in 1973. The contractor identified that the top ridge along the length of the apex between each of the steel supports was built with inadequate size wood, hence the sagging profile. This is now being addressed but the need for a structural survey has resulted in completion of the roof being delayed. Weather permitting; the work can now be completed. The opportunity to install high level ventilation in the roof has also been included in the project to address the comfort of the hall in summer.

Apologies to the users of the village hall and to the neighbours for the delay and any related noise issues.

#### THE OAK TREE ON THE GREEN

No doubt you will have noticed that the replacement Oak Tree on the Green has been removed. Unfortunately, earlier this year, the tree was plagued by an outbreak of the Oak Tree Processionary Moth, which, before this year, has been limited to the continent and south of the M25. Not only are the caterpillars a danger to the development of the tree, but they are also a hazard to the health of animals and people due to the large number of tiny hairs on each which they shed when they feel threatened. Those hairs can cause respiratory and eye problems and so the tree and nest had to be removed.

Monitoring of another oak tree in the vicinity has also been put into place but thankfully no moths have been found in the trap. In case you were wondering, the hole on the green has been left in case there are any more eggs underground, and the Green will be allowed time to recover before a replacement can be planted. Thank you to the eagle eyed dog walkers who spotted this before anyone was affected!
